



Trouble time motor

RECENT events in South Africa have highlighted the benefits of motor vehicle insurance that goes beyond the usual compre-

hensive policies.
Mr Don Gallimore, managing director of PFV Group Broking Services, says people are generally unaware of the need for special risk insurance cover, which is available to protect privately owned cars and motorcycles in the event of damage caused by acts of terrorism or politically inspired riots. Comprehensive policies do not cover these areas.

The cover, provided through the South African Special Risks Insurance Association (Sasria), is available from any insurer and the current premium is R10 a year.

"Because of their mobility, vehicles are far more exposed than any other assets. Many people have to travel near to potential trouble spots in the course of their day-to-day activities and stone-throwing incidents in the recent months have already caused considerable damage to a number of cars," Mr Gallimore

"Vehicles which were parked in the street and damaged by the bombs that recently exploded in Johannesburg would not have been covered unless the owners had taken insurance with Sasria."
